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## **Senior Pastor Report**

I love church, I love PCC.

Allow me a memory. (please) When our children were younger we had a Sunday routine. It involved Mexican food.

Most every Sunday 'after church' the Alexanders would go to La Terrazza for lunch. More likely than not we would run into other church folks and, on some occasions, we ate with them. Most Sunday's though, because I was among the last to leave and would walk in after others had settled, we would eat lunch by ourselves as a family.

I won't talk about the food, but it was good. Real good! What sticks with me is how the four of us would sit around the table, talking, for at least two hours (sometimes more). We would tell each other the stories of the week, catch up, share, address pressing concerns and laugh. A lot. We would laugh a lot. It's a good memory. Two grownups and two children, lubricated by fruit tea and experiencing a carbohydrate buzz, just being a family. I can't tell you what we talked about now. Who knows? Band? Scouts? Church? Work? Relatives? Movies? Vacations? Yard work? Who knows? All of that and none of that and some of that, depending on the day.

Looking back on that good memory there is no "one thing" about our Sunday routine that leaps out as a signal event, forever changing the fortunes of our family. But now, from a distance, the "one thing" that does stand out is how such a routine – itself – bonded us, grew us up as a family.

Here's where I apply the story to an annual report.

PCC had a great year in 2016. We grew, receiving 10 new members. Our Trustees provided excellent service in their stewardship of our finances and physical facilities. Our 'new' Deacons adjusted, made great strides in serving as a cohesive team, and accomplished much. Between those two leadership teams (Trustees & Deacons) our building looks different now and will look even better in the coming year. There were any number of "events," such as Walk Thru The Bible and a VBS at the Pines of Perinton. Our Kick-off Lunch in September set the tone of an energized congregation and we headed into the Fall with wind in our sails. Growth Groups and Youth Groups experienced a surge. Choir was awesome and the Christmas program was fantastic. Mission trips blessed those who went and those who they served. Ingathering was spectacular! MOPS powerfully served and blessed.

But, again, like at La Terrazza, there was no "one thing" that leaps out. It was ... life. Church life. Babies were born and dedicated. Marriages were consecrated. Saints who passed away were remembered. Children scampered through the halls. Seniors were graduated. Walls were painted. Community Meals were enjoyed. Prayers were lifted up, both in the worship assembly and, importantly, among individuals who cared for each other. It all happened. Sometimes in a hurry and with a flourish. Sometimes – most times, really – with unassuming, quiet, deep love and affection.

And where were the Elders? God bless them, they were in homes and at hospitals, showing up for birthday parties and grieving at funerals. They were teaching. They were helping others move,

supplying willing hands and hearty meals in times of joy and stress. They were praying. They cheered at softball games. Did I mention they were teaching? Oh yes, and praying — they were praying. Want to be sure and remember that. They were praying ... and they were teaching. They were being Elders.

I know the picture I've just painted is idealistic. PCC is not a perfect church and I'm not Norman Rockwell with words. Mistakes were made. Milk was spilled. Of course we – all of us – want be better and do more.

The Trustees, Deacons and Elders are all members of the church but they are certainly not all the members of the church. The leadership of the church functions best when they nurture the environment of God-honoring joy and safety. So it's never just "one thing". It's a lot of things, some quite large and some rather trivial. But the intent is always equipping the members to flourish in community as followers of Christ Jesus.

That's the blessing. That's the goal. A community flourishing in community as followers of Jesus.

And laughter, too.

## **Youth Pastor Report**

2016 was another great year for both youth and children's ministry at PCC. One of the highlights from this past year was in the start of 2016 we noticed that our youth ministry was growing, more families were coming to the church, and kids were bringing friends. This was a great problem but we soon realized that the youth ministry department was understaffed for the increased number of students. Over the summer of 2016, God filled this need and provided two new youth leaders, Larry and Jennifer Fisk. The Fisks have been a great addition to the youth ministry leadership team. They have a heart to serve the Lord and they fit in great with the other youth leaders (Tiffany Walter, Jeff Hoyt and me). This addition of two more youth leaders allowed us to refocus some aspects of the youth ministry. For a couple of years now I have thought it was important for us to spend more time in small groups. We had typically only broken up into small groups on retreats and other big events, but starting in the fall of 2016 we started adding meeting in small groups to our weekly meetings.

As a whole this has been an extremely positive addition to the youth ministry. We break up into small groups after each lesson on Sunday night for about 20 minutes. We break up into 4 sets of small groups both by age and gender (Jr/ Sr High boys and girls). This allows students to review the lesson together, and see how to apply it to their lives. We feel this time has been productive and looking forward to see where God leads to the small group ministry in the future.

Throughout the Fall the youth ministry continued to grow, and this was on full display when we took our largest group, in at least the last 10 years, on our annual Fall retreat. This retreat was a great time for our students, and provided them with a wonderful opportunity to grow closer to each other, and learn more about God. Over the weekend our theme was ONE. We looked at the One true God, and the One way to have a relationship with him.

One of the other highlights of the 2016 year of ministry was announcing that we are going to have an intergenerational to Costa Rica from July 12-20, 2017. This trip will be our 4th trip since 2009 to Costa Rica. We will be working alongside the ministries of Christ for the City International. I am excited about taking this team to Costa Rica. While it is an intergenerational mission trip, many of the people who are a part of the trip are students and families from our youth ministry program. I am very thankful that God has continued to provide a connection with PCC and Christ for the City International in Costa Rica. I look forward to see how this relationship continues to grow throughout the years.

# Worship Pastor/Magnification

2016 was an exciting year for me personally as Worship Pastor. While I will give an overview of the highlights from 2016, I wish to say that the worship of PCC is still my highest priority. I will continue to strive for authentic true worship by choosing music that is biblically based reflecting spiritual truth. I will also continue to encourage members to feel a freedom to worship by responding naturally to all that God is and all that he has done.

2015 saw us finish the second year of the "Gospel According to Scrooge". The demands of such a production created a high level of fatigue in our people. As a result in 2016, I did not wish overburden them with extra rehearsals for Holy Week. Still, I felt compelled to do something for Easter. I was drawn to "The Living Last Supper", a recreation of the Last Supper, a drama with music by the choir. This served us well as it required minimal rehearsal time by the actors and the choir was able to make use of their own regularly scheduled rehearsal times. The production done on Good Friday saw 271 people attend not including the actors and choir. I was grateful to see such a turnout.

Summer allowed me to continue to expand my ministry outward as DL and I worked with Pittsford Community Church to create a Vacation Bible School in the Pines of Perinton. This was the second year that we did this. I was grateful to be part of the planning and the music, where I felt very comfortable using my gifts. With this being our second year I thought everything went more smoothly and we had between 20 and 30 children there each day. This year, I look forward to engaging in more opportunities to minister at the Pines and in other parts of our community.

The fall saw the choir singing all new material but they ceased on the first Sunday of Advent for we were working on a larger project. "Home for the Holidays: A Classic American Christmas," took place in December for two evenings. I created this show based on classic American Christmas favorite songs from the likes of Perry Como, Bing Crosby and the Andrews Sisters among others. We set up the sanctuary as a dinner theater and had close to 150 people each night. Many people helped serve coffee and pie to those that attended making the event a wonderful gift to our church family and community.

When I look back at 2016 I see a year of progress and an increasing desire towards drama and music. It has always been present, but PCC is starting to be known as the "musical" church and I wish to capitalize on the momentum.

### **Elders Team**

In 2016 we interviewed and welcomed ten new members to our church family. We also removed thirty two members who indicated they wanted their membership discontinued as they have relocated. Three members died in 2016. At the end of 2016 we had 147 members.

One highlight for 2016 was the ordination of DL Walter. The congregation approved the formation of an ordination counsel which met on June 18, 2016. The council met and wholeheartedly affirmed DL's call to ministry and recommend ordination. An ordination service was held Sunday, June 26, 2016.

The elders have worked to promote, develop and strengthen small group ministry. We currently have over 90 adults meeting in small groups. In the Fall we launched a church wide study of Nehemiah and encouraged all small groups to participate in this study. There have been gatherings of small group representatives to encourage and support small group ministry. We are thankful that Anne Hartsough has taken over as our small group ministry coordinator.

We held two joint meetings with the deacons team to encourage and interact with them as they learn to serve together. (see deacon team report).

One of the priorities of the elders is to encourage and develop new leadership. We will have an elders retreat in January with an emphasis of identifying and developing new leadership at PCC. Equipping the next generation of leaders is vital for our health and continued growth as we seek to live out our purposes to the glory of God.

Two of our elders, Wally Forstrom and Chad Goodchild have completed six years as elders and taking the required Sabbatical in 2017. We appreciate their service to our church family.

### **Trustee Board**

The year 2016 has, once again, been a very blessed time for the Perinton Community Church. Although, for the first time in several years, our annual expenses exceeded our annual income, it was by less than one quarter of one percent of income. The difference, \$1278, was easily covered by our current fund balance. This indicates the responsible way our church family manages our programs and facility, and how the Lord is honoring our efforts.

Through the year we have made a number of improvements to our beautiful and practical, though aging, building. The most significant is the creation of an ADA standard bathroom in place of the two small bathrooms off of the office hallway. There are also many enhancements suggested by our Deacons team to make our building more useful and comfortable to our congregation and attractive to visitors. These include new signage, new welcome center and new furniture and decor creating a lounge-meeting area downstairs. Also most lighting fixtures throughout the building have been upgraded.

Another item, while it really is not important, some may want to know whatever became of that cellphone tower? Late in the prior year a company presented PCC with a proposal to build a cell tower on a portion of our property. Although such a project did not seem consistent with the church purpose, the Trustees put the issue on our agenda because it could have a potential for resources to support new projects or increased mission outreach. We met with a company representative to discuss PCC's concerns and requirements. They never got back to us.

In November the Trustees proposed, and the church membership approved, an operating budget of nearly \$474,000 for 2017. This provided for several modest salary increases, consistent use of utilities and supplies, standard building maintenance, and increases in some of our missions support. Also approved was the use of \$39,000 from surplus current funds for continued improvements to our building and grounds. This, along with the balance of funds approved in the prior year, is to be used to upgrade the bathrooms in the youth Sunday School area and for other repair and beautification projects around the building and parking lot. We are preparing our church home for the celebration of our 50th birthday in 2018.

We continue to emphasize a different missionary or mission agency each month. Ministry moments during worship services are used as often as they are available. We have also taken advantage of Adult Christian Education time between quarterly sessions.

We also continue to appreciate the cooperation and encouragement of our congregation, our elders, and our pastors. The elders have committed to having an elder present at each of our monthly meetings. Wally Forstrom has been particularly involved and we have appreciated his input and faithfulness.

We have been very pleased to assist PCC people in their efforts to be involved in missions. This year we were grateful for the opportunity to assist Brady Seaman in his desire to return to Costa Rica on his own to minister with Carlos and Christ in The City. We also had an opportunity to assist Sue and Tim Wilson in their trip to India and Nepal with Asian Concerns International and Gulshan Lal. They were able to preach and give basic health education talks to groups including orphans.

Our missionaries are very busy dedicated people who do not have much time to visit supporting churches. We treasure the times when they are able to come and share how the Lord is using them in spreading His Gospel message. We particularly enjoyed hearing from the Hairgroves in January and the Tills in October.

We encourage the involvement of our congregation in serving local missions as individuals or as growth groups. We have posted the website addresses of our local missions on the PCC website so that members can go directly to any of our local missions to research volunteer opportunities.

Ingathering is always special. But this year's Ingathering seemed extra special. We collected \$19,000 for the replacement of the foundation of the orchard building at Camp Cherith. The fundraising effort involved many from the congregation giving testimony to the blessed effect Camp Cherith has had on their lives. The youth filled our baptistery with paper products for the camp. A follow up to the Ingathering will take place at Camp Cherith as a celebration, work day at camp on May 6!

Financial activity during 2016 resulted in a net loss of \$1,278 (0.3% of budget) compared to a net income last year (2015) of \$16,552. Expenses were 1.4% below budget while income was 1.7% below budget. The 2017 budget of \$473,914 requires an average income of \$39,493 per month which is a 4.4% increase over our 2016 giving of \$37,824 per month.

Other items of note:

Ingathering giving for Camp Cherith was \$19,636.

The Money Market Account with \$45,311 was closed since it was earning

only 0.1% interest. In it's place \$75,000 was deposited into a 2 yr CD

which is insured and will earn 1.4% interest.

A special thanks to Bob Peterson, Coralie Hoselton, Ed Marr, Crystal Nickson, and Al Soanes for their service as Assistant Treasurers this past year. Also, a thank you to Crystal Nickson for serving as Deputy Treasurer in my absence.

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
